

Requirements for International Clinical Observership at St. Luke's College of Medicine

Submit the following 30 days prior to rotation:

1. Letter of Intent addressed to:

Please indicate dates of clinical observership and area of specialty or interest

2. School Certificate/Letter allowing you to participate in an outside or international rotation. Whenever applicable, you will be responsible for your visa requirements.
3. Certificate of Good Standing from your school.
4. Medical and Laboratory Examinations
 - a) Chest X-ray report (not older than one year)
 - b) Proof of vaccination on protective titers from the following:
 - i) Hep B (HepBsAg negative or HepBsAb positive)
 - ii) RPR
 - iii) Anti HCV
 - iv) Varicella (or proof of recovery, such as titers)
 - v) HIV screen
5. Proof of International Health Insurance Coverage
6. Clinical Observership and Processing Fee (non-refundable): USD\$ 200.00 (per 4 week rotation)

A reference code will be given from the Accounting Office to acknowledge receipt of payment. Afterwhich, all documents will be processed for the Clinical Observership.
